AABS in Nigeria



It was in 2004 that Rev. Aloysius Godfrey joined AABS and started a Bible school in his home country of Nigeria, making Nigeria the first country other than Ghana to have an AABS-affiliated school. Five years later, Rev. Godfrey became the very first AABS national director.

Nigeria, larger than the state of Texas and Africa's most populous nation, is home to over 200 million people. Nearly half its population is under the age of eighteen. Nigeria is divided roughly in half between Muslims, who live mostly in the north, and Christians, who live mostly in the south.¹ Rev Godfrey lives in Port Harcourt (see picture), a city of over a million people, with an additional two million in the surrounding area, located in the oil-rich Niger River delta in the Rivers state along the Atlantic Coast.



Currently, Rev. Godfrey oversees 31 schools located in 13 of Nigeria's 36 states, most of them in the south, with a combined total of 728 students. About one-third of these schools meet three times per week, a few meet full time, and the rest on weekends. They are directed by pastors and other church leaders, including several women.

Pray for these Bible school directors. They are praying that 2021 will be a better year than 2020, for open doors, and one requests prayer "for peace in our state."

Thank you for your support which enables us to provide resources and encouragement for both Rev. Godfrey and all the schools as he and they continue their work in Nigeria.
